

Purpose

Classified Ads

Each subscriber is entitled to one 20 word classified ad free of charge per issue. Additional words over the limit are 10¢ per word. Multiple insertions of same ad are discouraged. This is to allow for a varied ad content in each issue. Multiple insertion ads for more than 2 issues must be run as a display ad. All ads must be printed neatly and be received by the 10th of the month before next issue. All issues mailed on the first of the month.

Payment

All ads must be paid for in advance. Make checks payable to Antique Radio Classified.

Subscription Rate

Subscriptions are available on a yearly basis, \$15.00 per year. Sample issues: \$1.50.

It is the intent of this publication to provide a means of communications within the hobby on a national basis. The growth and interest in any hobby is only perpetuated when the common interest of each collector is shared by all. It is this interest that all collectors face - namely the acquisition of new items for their collections, along with the dispersal of items not needed. In simple terms this means to buy, sell or trade items.

It is in this aspect that this publication is being published. A survey was given to many collectors nationally, and the results showed that they felt a publication of this type was needed. This publication will be mainly a classified ad type of format where collectors may advertise their wants and items for sale, and be able to reach a large readership. This large unified readership of collectors will permit the individual collector to accomplish their goals. This publication will not attempt to cover other aspects of the hobby, as there are many fine club bulletins and periodicals now available that fulfill this need.

It is envisioned that subscriptions will number between one and two thousand people. This is an immense undertaking in the way of labor and cost. The printing and postage costs in any publication are extremely high along with many hidden costs. It is this problem that must be faced by the subscriber. A trade off between a quality publication and a reasonable subscription fee has to be considered. The overall survey suggested that the classified ads should be free to all subscribers within a reasonable word limit. Therefore, to cover cost, the basic subscription price would have to be higher as there is little additional income to support such a large publication. Considering what the benefits of a publication of this type will provide to the collector, the additional cost over-shadows this aspect.

With the support of collectors like yourself, this publication will become the standard of this great hobby. With my twelve years of providing services to the radio hobby, along with my reputation and dedication, this publication will succeed!

This issue is being mailed several days in advance of the October 1st mailing date. I will be at the annual A.W.A. Conference this Sept. 26-29th, along with 500 other collectors. Hope to see many of my new subscribers. For those of you who have never been to this meet, it is perhaps the largest gathering of collectors at one event for a good time of buying and selling radios, along with the many programs scheduled. If you have a chance to attend, then do, you will not be disappointed!

I just returned from the N.F.W.A./A.W.A. meet a few weeks ago at Buffalo, N.Y., about 70 collectors showed up for this meet. A flea market was the first event on the program. After that interesting talks were given on the operation of battery radios using batteries, battery eliminators, and modern power supplies. The contest concluded the program, with the entries all hooked-up in playing condition. Ribbons were awarded to the contestants in various categories. The N.F.W.A. publishes a quarterly club bulletin, and membership is open to all.

Reader's Q's & A's-----Q: Why was my ad not printed in the first issue? A: Most likely reason was that your ad arrived after the 10th of the month deadline. Also with many ads being received, it is easy to make a mistake. Finally, there is the problem of available space in each issue. Ads are put in on a first-come, first-served basis. Late ads that will not fit the available space will be held for the next issue. Do not put your ads on your written letters, etc. They must be separate, preferably on a 3x5" index card. Q: Please clarify what constitutes a free 20 word ad. A: Although not stated at the onset of this publication, a 20 word ad was to include your name and address as a word count. I realize this doesn't leave many words for your description, but a limit has to be set on word count, thus enabling us to get a little income to help pay for this publication. (At present we are losing money, the only way this publication can continue is with more subscribers - again I am asking for your help in letting other collectors know of this publication.) Q: Can I run more than 2 ads in the same issue. A: Yes, you may as long as payment is made for anything over the first 20 words of your first free ad.


In my last issue I asked for your opinion on the classified ad format, separate for sale and wanted ads or mixed ads. The response has been 5 to 1 in favor of mixed ads. We will continue with the present format as determined by those responding to the survey.

If you were selling something and didn't get a response, perhaps your prices were too high or else the demand for your items do not exist in large numbers of people.

THE COLLECTORS CORNER



The "Collectors Corner" will appear as a regular feature of Antique Radio Classified. It is an attempt to build knowledge and interest of radio collectors primarily in AC home receivers of the late 20's to the 1940's, with emphasis on the lesser known and more unusual styles and brands. Helpful restoration hints will be given where possible. An unusual radio from England is featured this month. Style and mechanics are quite unlike that of any American set. What looks to be a radio made for a specific segment of the radio market was a long time big seller in England.

This is the Ekco model A-22, manufactured by E.K. Cole Ltd. of Southend-On-Sea, Essex, England. It is a 3 band superhet using 4 tubes. The bands covered are the European long wave broadcast band 950-2000 meters, 310-150 kc., medium wave 200-550m, 1500-540kc. and short wave 16-50m, 19-6mc. It operates from 200-250 volts AC, 40-80 cycles. The A-22 was released in November of 1945 selling for the equivalent of \$72. The plastic cabinet was available in walnut or black with brass or chrome trim respectively.

The A-22 was designed by architect Welles Coates and was featured in the 1946 "Britain Can Make It" Exhibition held at the Victoria & Albert Museum in London. This was a showcase for the world to see that post war British industry was alive and kicking. The striking round shape first appeared with the AD65 of 1934 and marked a distinct break from traditional radio design. Other Ekco models used the popular design well into the 1950's.

The A-22 is 14 1/2" tall, 13" wide, 7" deep, and weighs 18 lbs. The chassis consists of a vertical circular member with 3 tubes mounted horizontally along with filter capacitors, choke, IF transformers and 6" speaker. Bypass capacitors and resistors are mounted on a flange on the outside edge of the circular chassis.

The rectifier tube and power and output transformers are mounted on a horizontal compartment with switches, tuner, volume control and trimmers mounted below. The tuner is friction driven. A pulley off the tuner drives an arm with a dial light on the end. This travels around the dial scale providing spot lighted tuning indication.

Four Mullard tubes are used. A metallized (spray shield) ECH35, a triode-hexode works as an oscillator and RF amplifier. A metallized EF39, a variable mu RF pentode operates as IF amplifier. An EBL31 double diode pentode operates as AVC, 2nd detector, and output tube. High voltage is supplied by an AZ31 full wave rectifier tube.

The art deco styling of the A-22 makes it a very collectable piece. It is an interesting addition to any collection. I hope everyone enjoyed some information on this somewhat unique (to the U.S. anyway) radio.

COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE

Most radio collectors will agree that there has been a need for basic price guidelines on early radios. There is also a group who would much rather not see one. Due to condition, originality and other extenuating factors, it is quite a difficult task to assign one price for a radio. Although I know I am leaving myself wide open for criticism, so it shall have to be. In the interests of growth in the collecting field, here are my appraisals.

Since it is logical to start at the beginning, this month will include a basic radio group of the "A's". The volume of Atwater Kents has limited me to listing only a few of the models made. Thanks goes to Ralph Williams, who, due to his vast knowledge on anything pertaining to the Atwater Kent line, was able to fill me in on their prices.

The prices quoted below represent a complete radio with operating tubes and transformers, good original condition with no holes added or refinished cabinet. They do not reflect your average flea market or house sale. Instead it is a basic "top buck" you may pay at an auction with other collectors present. Antique dealers know that few items take actual "tops" depending on availability and condition. Please keep this in mind when perusing my list.


