MEET REPORT

Radiofest 2011 Antique Radio Club Of Illinois August 4, 5, 6, 2011

adiofest is an annual, three-day Vintage Radio Event hosted by the Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) and assisted by four other groups: WARCI, Wisconsin; VRPS, Texas; AWA, New York; and MARC, Michigan. We attract collectors, restorers, historians, engineers, technicians, buyers, sellers, and the newly interested. The event, held in the spacious Willowbrook, Illinois Holiday Inn and Convention Center, on Kingery Avenue, is easily accessible from Interstate 55 exit 274, Illinois highway 83. Excellent, comfortable surroundings are provided for all the activities by a seasoned and competent hotel staff. Radiofest 2011 ran Thursday August 4 through 6. Following are some highlights from that event.

Radiofest 2011 was well under way by Thursday afternoon, with the registration and hospitality committees welcoming and accommodating the early arrivals. Activity built with more arrivals in preparation for the convention's opening event: the Main Auction in the Ballroom at 6:30 p.m. In short order, the ballroom was filled with vintage items and eager bidders. A 10-foot-tall projection screen and excellent remote control video camera worked beautifully to provide bidders with an unsurpassed view of the auction items. Just think of a typical radio front panel projected onto a 100-foot screen! Where necessary, the auction handling team filled in shadows and highlighted details with handheld LED lights-treatment usually reserved for the fashion world and super-model photo shoots. ARCI member and professional auctioneer, Jim Sargent from Dallas, Texas, presided over the auction, and in about three hours, over 150 lots passed over the auction block with sales just over \$16,000. A free pizza party followed the auction and checkout, with the camaraderie extending on into the late evening.

A museum-level historic equipment display, "One Hundred Years of Amateur Radio, From Spark to Solid State," was featured in the Hotel Atrium area, just outside the ballroom. Over 80 rare artifacts from as far back at 1898 were on display along with gear that spanned the years, all the way from World War I through the 1970s. To call it simply splendid would be an understatement. The equipment came from the personal collections of our members and included early ARRL convention memorabilia.

By Friday morning nearly all the vendor selling spaces were filled. And those spaces were filled with really great stuff! Walking through the flea market sales area early Friday morning, I observed that the attendance was on par with past years. I felt just like a kid on Christmas morning. There was something for everyone, including nicely restored sets for the collector, restoration project sets for the upcoming winter, vacuum tubes, component parts, vintage papers, magazines, tech manuals, and-for free!-plenty of good conversation. The flea market area buzzed with activity through the day. It was ready to resume on Saturday, but was dampened by a persistent rain that ultimately led to an earlier-thanplanned closing.

The Vintage Equipment Contest, always a popular part of our event, was held in a room convenient to the Ballroom and Atrium. The Best of Show Award went to Mike Feldt for his pre-1930 Remler Infradyne radio. Nineteen awards from 10 contest categories were announced during the Banquet Program Friday evening. The contest room always rates a visit because this is where our members show their very best items, and this year was no exception.

With Amateur Radio as part of the theme, the Vintage Ham Station was in operation outside in a tent near the flea market. It was just like a ham radio Field Day in the 1950s, but with access to AC power—no gas cans were needed to feed the generator. Amateur Radio license testing was conducted at Radiofest by a team of ARRL Volunteer Examiners (VEs). One applicant advanced to a General class license, while another just missed his move up to Extra class.

Beginning at mid-morning Friday a series of one-hour educational forums were presented in the main ballroom, conducted by veteran radio experts, collectors, engineers, and historians. The speakers and their subjects included: "A Vacuum Tube Audio Panel" by

Karl Johnson, Pete Nauseda, and Terry Shaver; "Vacuum Tube Numbering Systems" by Bob Dobusch; "The Ham Radio Forum" by Bill Ross; "The Process of Broadcasting" by Al Germond; "Seeing Sound" by Bret Menassa; and "Chicago Experimental Television" by Steve Jaikowski, whose presentation included a book signing. The sessions were well attended with appreciative responses from their audiences.

The Annual Ladies luncheon convened promptly at 11:30 a.m. with Janet, the leader of the Hospitality Committee, holding forth with the usual revelry and door prizes. It's always a fun time for the ladies.

An unexpected highlight occurred when executives from WGN Radio and the Museum of Broadcast Communications visited Radio-

fest on Friday afternoon. We were pleased to give WGN Vice President and General Manager Tom Longmeyer, WGN Program Director Bill White, and Museum of Broadcasting Vice President David Plier the grand tour. They, too, have a great interest in vintage radio and its history and liked what they saw, enjoyed our hospitality, and gave words of encouragement.

The Friday evening banquet gave attendees the opportunity to relax and enjoy an excellent meal in an top-notch dining atmosphere. In the program that followed the meal, we enjoyed remarks from veteran broadcaster Chuck Shaeden, who is unsurpassed in his knowledge of vintage radio programs. In addition, Stephen Parry presented a sneak preview of his newly produced WLS National Barn-Dance video, which was to premier on PBS in mid September. ARCI volunteers who make each Radiofest possible (and there are many) were recognized and presented with certificates of appreciation. The evening's events were brought to a close by an hour of entertainment by the Wise Guys Trio, who took us back to the kind of musical variety shows often heard on radio in the 1930s and '40s. There were many smiles, some dancing, and much foot tapping.

The flea market sales usually resume on Saturday morning around 7 a.m., but, as mentioned, this time the rain didn't let up. Most of the sellers "packed it in," but waited anxiously for the Saturday morning finale to Radiofest: the ARCI Donation Auction. It is a key point of interest to buyers and serious bargain hunters.

During Radiofest three or four selling spaces are reserved and staffed by ARCI volunteers who receive items donated to the club. Attendees can visit the space anytime Thursday or Friday morning, bargain with the attendant for a fair price, and purchase on the spot. You never know what will show up at the donation site. Then on Saturday at 10:30 a.m., all remaining items are auctioned without reserve. Rain greatly diminished this Saturday activity, both in morning donations and buyers, but sales were still made and bargains were carried home. In the end, over \$700 was realized.

By noon Saturday the event was finished, and the tents were down and packed up. The ham radio, video, and sound equipment was re-loaded into the trucks. A still somewhat damp crew of ARCI volunteers huddled in the parking lot, deciding on a place to go for lunch, where plans for Radiofest 2012 would take shape. To all our friends, and friends-tobe: Now you know who we are and what we

RESTORATION REPORT

The 1933 Majestic 161 Chrome-Front Radio

Grigsby-Grunow introduced its fabulous Majestic model 161 "smart set" during the twilight of its regrettably all-too-short reign in the radio business. The first of the company's modernistic smart sets had been introduced back in the summer of 1933, and they had been instant hits. Encouraged by this success, the company went on to introduce additional models, including in late September the four modernistic consoles of which the Lido is a striking example. The rarely seen model 161 appears to have been one of the last of the line, making its debut in late 1933 or early 1934, shortly before the company closed its doors for the last time.

Grigsby-Grunow was declared bankrupt in February 1934. If there was ever a perfect illustration of "twilight's last gleaming," it was when the company introduced its "smart sets." For these magnificent examples of the radio art came tantalizingly close to averting the company's inexorable slide toward bankruptcy and corporate oblivion. So popular were the sets that for the nine months ending November '33, the company sold eight times more radios than in the corresponding period a year earlier. However, it was not enough to save them. Advertising for the 161 gives its list price as \$47.50.

Most smart sets were given an official name, such as Lido, Mayfair, or Ritz, a practice that Grigsby-Grunow had begun a few years earlier. However, for some reason, the 161 is among a minority of sets that had to make do with just a model number.

Just when the model 161 was introduced is unclear. It does not feature in the list of models released during the summer of 1933, nor have I found any evidence of its being introduced in the fall at the same time as the Lido. Moreover, the earliest advertising that I've found for it was in April of 1934 for a clearance sale.

On November 24, 1933, Grigsby-Grunow went into equity receivership. The company continued to manufacture its smart sets, albeit at a reduced rate, through February 20, 1934, when it went into bankruptcy. Announcements in Radio Retailing reveal that new model introductions continued during receivership, through at least January 1934 (one of the last models was the 608 "Mayfair"). Additionally, the press release announcing a company hosted meeting of Majestic distributors, which was scheduled to take place just days prior to the bankruptcy, spoke of yet more new model introductions. However, what these models were and whether or not any were manufactured appears lost to the annals of time. Media advertising for Majestic radios and refrigerators was sustained through December 1933, the receiver having allocated a \$35,000 advertising budget for that month. Corroborating this, newspaper ads are plentiful through December, but they dry up after that. However, I've found no mention in any of published sources of the model 161. This all leads me to conclude that the 161 was first offered for sale in late 1933 or early 1934. If this is correct, its late introduction, not long before the company closed its doors, offers a good explanation of why it's such a rarity today.

On April 26, 1934, two months after Grigsby-Grunow's untimely demise, Gamble Stores ran an advertisement in numerous newspapers across the central United States that featured the model 161 along with several other Ma-

jestic smart sets. This is the only newspaper ad I've found that shows the model 161. According to the copy, the store chain had purchased \$200,000 worth of late production sets, which they then proceeded to liquidate at discounted prices. This particular ad seems to have appeared only on this one date, as I found no earlier or later occurrences of it. One might therefore conclude that Gamble Stores was successful in quickly selling off most of its inventory of these sets. Given the stylishness of the merchandise, this should be no surprise!

My Majestic Restoration Project

I obtained my 161 "as found" from the friend of a club member. I traded a mint Majestic 411 for this disaster 161. I asked fellow

radiophile Mark Topo if he would take on the cabinet restoration and refinishing, and I must say he did an amazingly beautiful job. The accompanying pictures are Mark's and he took them as he did the restoration work.



The front view of cabinet before any reconstruction and refinishing also shows how much work was ahead; note the missing bottom and destroyed grille cloth. Luckily, all three bezel pieces were in good condition and polished up nicely.

I held onto the radio chassis and speaker, which were in comparatively good condition, and completely disassembled the radio and stripped the chassis so I could get it chromed—you all know chrome radios perform and sound better, right?

I polished up the pot-metal IF transformer and the two original electrolytic cans. I also had all the hardware, second output IF transformer can, power transformer end bell, the Goat tube shield, the chassis, and front grille chrome plated. Additionally, I cleaned up the tuning capacitor frame and hand painted it silver. Finally, I reassembled and rewired the chassis.

The output IF transformer is a triple coil device with all coils the same number of turns, same wire size, and wound together (it looks like litz wire covered with linen thread). With one winding, the primary is tuned with a variable capacitor to 175 kHz. There are six leads coming out of this transformer coil, and although they are color-coded, it still took a bit of reverse engineering to find the intended primary. I had good pictures but it was impossible to see accurately the colors. I ended up taking the coil and the original variable compression capacitor and connecting them in parallel to each winding, one at a time, with the RF generator driving one end through a 10K resistor and the scope across the tuned coil and varying the RF oscillator.

Each coil had a different resonance but one peaked at 175 kHz, which then became the primary. Grigsby-Grunow Majestic used the second coil for the audio detector and the third for the automatic volume control. This is a somewhat unusual design, but it certainly works. I've also found that Grigsby-Grunow Majestic loads the audio detector circuit (the volume control) with 500K, but if it's loaded with 180K to 200K the audio distortion (THD) drops to less than 2 percent from 8 percent, a redesign I put in all the 460 chassis I restore.

The radio worked great right after completing the rebuilding. A full alignment went well and I'm very pleased to report that today the radio performs as good as it looks.
