

TELEVISION RESTORATION

Restoration of a Raytheon 10DX24 Television Set




Figure 1. Raytheon 10DX24 front view.

have restored a good number of old black & white television sets in my day, but I have to say that my restoration of a Raytheon 10DX24 was difficult! I acquired this TV in fairly decent shape from an owner advertising it on Craigslist.

It's a fairly rare TV, built in 1948. Officially, it is a Raytheon-Belmont TV; that is, it was marketed under the Belmont label, a Raytheon subsidiary for radio and television products. At that time, Raytheon had a brief flirtation with the marketing of commercial radio and television sets. Unfortunately, it was out of the commercial business by the 1960s. I obtained a SAMS Photofact schematic for this unit from a former Raytheon employee.

The set is transformerless, meaning that the AC line is brought directly in, is rectified, filtered, and sent on to provide various B+ supplies in the chassis. Manufacturers wanted to get rid of the heavy, bulky, and expensive power transformer. There were no fuses or circuit breakers in this unit, and a component failure could easily cause a fire or open a fuse or circuit breaker in the house power panel. It uses 25 tubes, including a 10BP4 CRT, which was a fairly common 10-inch round CRT in its day. While to this day some designs remain transformerless, the chassis of the newer sets are better isolated from the outside world. Yet, I see that manufacturers are still omitting any type of line protection!

Getting Started

Warning: Television receivers operate at voltages as high as 20,000 volts. Unless you have experience and knowledge of electronic devices, do not attempt to work on them due to the possibility of electric shock. Make sure to have all the necessary test equipment. These voltages are lethal!

The first thing I noticed in this chassis was that the selenium rectifiers used to create the B+ in the power supply were bad, a common occurrence in transformerless designs. After many years of sustaining a surge current from TV turnon the rectifiers become lossy, overheat, and can no longer provide sufficient B+. I replaced each of these units with silicon diodes (600 PIV, 1 amp) and 10 ohm, 10 watt resistors in series with each diode. The power resistor is there to more closely simulate the loss provided by the original selenium unit(s) in operation. Without it—in other words, blindly replacing a selenium unit with a silicon diode and no series resistor—the B+ is way too high and could result in damage to other components, such as the filter capacitors, and/or improper chassis operation.

Only *after* replacing the rectifiers *and* the electrolytic filter capacitors in the chassis did I turn the unit on. All tubes should also be tested on a quality tube tester before applying power.

(NOTE: Power should NEVER be applied to a chassis that hasn't been checked for bad rectifiers and electrolytic capacitors in the power supply because of the danger or damage and/ or fire!) I measured the resulting B+ value at various points and found it to be within specifications. I obtained a raster by feeding the TV with test video on Channel 3 from a VCR and using a balun into the chassis input 300 ohm twin-lead terminals. The resulting raster was rolling, out of sync, and had poor focus. I did note, however, that the distorted screen raster was very bright, indicating a healthy CRT after 60-plus years!

I then replaced every wax capacitor in the unit. Interestingly, some wax capacitors were in the oscillator-type HV unit (two 35L6 tubes in an oscillator unit to drive a HV rectifier) and not a more modern, common flyback type unit. I left these wax capacitors alone only because the HV unit oscillated at a low frequency, meaning that the capacitors were not required to do critical service. This is *not* true for other wax capacitors in this chassis; some are called upon to pass critical horizontal and vertical timing pulses. If these are distorted by poor capacitor function, the picture will suffer. After I replaced all the capacitors the unit functioned properly.

An interesting note here is that the schematic of the unit did not agree with the as-built TV




Figure 2. Raytheon 10DX24 bottom view.

in the area of the horizontal and vertical sweep drive circuitry. Perhaps there were changes in manufacturing being done "on the fly" for various lots of TVs being produced that did not get into the documentation, but it did cause me to scratch my head more than once!

Restoration in Progress

Figure 1 shows the Raytheon TV on the bench. Note the white ceramic capacitors (small, cylindrical units) that replaced the wax units previously used. An alternate view of the chassis is shown in **Figure 2**. The large black box shown attached to the chassis and sitting on the bench is the oscillator driven high voltage unit.




Figure 3. Slug tuned assembly.

Not shown in these views is the RF tuner assembly, which employs several slug tuned coils attached to a moving carriage assembly. In the original design, the coils were attached to the carriage with retaining clips (see **Figure 3**).

As the carriage moved up and down in response to movement of the front rotary tuning dial, the tuning slugs moved up and down in concert with the carriage assembly. Most of the retaining clips for the slugs were either broken or missing. In an attempt to find a replacement for the clips, I discovered that plastic retaining clips with nails, as used to secure telephone wire to walls, had the proper




Figure 4. Slug tuned assembly with new clips.

hole size to permit threading onto the slugs threaded rods. The nails that came with these clips were removed and the clips were threaded onto the slug rods and then secured to the moving carriage assembly using miniature tie wraps (see **Figure 4**).

With this arrangement, the tuner worked perfectly, once the slugs were aligned properly for channel tuning. Mechanical dimensions for alignment of the slugs were referenced in the SAMS Photofact.

Finally I sanded the cabinet for the unit and gave it several coats of lacquer for preservation. The end result is the completed 10DX24 with period rabbit ears and a digital converter box, which I keep in my guest room (see **Figure 5**).


With the clean signal provided by the box (no ghosts!) and the wide bandwidth provided by the TV, the picture detail is outstanding. Unfortunately, the tuning knob on the unit is not original, and I am currently searching for one. I have deliberately not added a reproduction back panel (which is available for sale, believe it or not) so that a visitor can easily look into the set from the rear and see it in operation.

BROADCASTING HISTORY

The Visual Lee de Forest

s longtime radio fans and A.R.C. readers, you already know that Lee de Forest invented the triode radio tube and a sound film technology. But what you may not know is that he also participated in the invention of television, described in the 1920s as "radio with pictures" and "radio movies." For a good part of the last century, de Forest developed technology, received patents, and even created content for popular media that we still consume today. It's a fascinating story so let's take a look at the life and inventing career of the scientist most responsible for the early devices that led to radio, film, and television.


Lee de Forest received his Ph.D. in physics and electricity from Yale in 1899, just as the new century was about to dawn on a world that was still silent, the world of the soundless film of Edison and others as depicted in the film *Hugo*, and of the voiceless key clicks of Marconi's wireless telegraph. De Forest had studied and learned from those inventors, and by 1906, had patented his signature invention, a vacuum tube he called the "audion." Because of his tube, radios, and later film and television, would be able to "speak." De Forest turned the science of the 19th Century into the media technology and art of the 20th Century, supplying the missing voice.

It Begins with Radio

In March 1907, a story in the *New York Times* describes how de Forest sent music from a location in New York to the Times building: "The perfection of the wireless telephone will also mean that houses will not have to be wired to receive music." A few years later, working in a Palo Alto, California, lab he further developed his tube as an amplifier of audio. This would be his most important contribution to the media of the 20th Century. With amplification, radio technology

moved from being the province of amateurs with headphones to that of families listening to loudspeakers. He started several pre-1920 radio stations, in New York and in San Francisco at the California Theatre.

He turned to the cinema in 1918 and filed a patent for his sound-on-film system. By the early 1920s he had made a number of short movies and was showing them publicly. The tube he developed in Palo Alto was the key to this technological advance as it allowed playback of sound using loudspeakers, making it possible for mid-1920s audiences to experience for the first time both radio and talking pictures. For his tremendous contribution to the industry, de Forest received an Oscar in 1960. Film's transition from a silent media is well told in the movie *The Artist*.

A 1919 Radio News story suggested combining silent film and radio for "radio movies." In New York opera singers would perform live while watching their filmed performance and try to remain in sync. A microphone would pick up the sound and send it over radio. In San Francisco a print of the film would be screened and the sound track picked up using a radio receiver. Practical amplifiers and loudspeakers were not available this early, but it was a prediction of how television might look.

Unlike the clear vision behind his major successes in radio and film, de Forest's early ideas about television technology were not fully formed. He told the *Los Angeles Herald* in 1923: "Moving pictures can be sent by radio just as still photographs are now sent. But it will be many years—I'm not afraid to

predict centuries-before radio movies will be practical. Modern science today is absolutely in the dark as to any discovery which would make the broadcasting of motion pictures anything as practical as the broadcasting of sounds." Although he was being interviewed about his sound movie invention, he had not really thought about television, other than as an extension of radio and the movies, stating, "Broadcasting moving pictures by radio will be impossible during this generation due to prohibitive costs and other impractical considerations." He understood bandwidth, a problem faced by his contemporaries Philo Farnsworth, working in San Francisco, and Charles Jenkins, in Los Angeles. De Forest himself filed several 1931 patents for the soonto-be-doomed mechanical television. Those first electronic and mechanical systems for television were limited to a tiny picture of 40 or 50 lines of resolution, and the pictures were

broadcast using AM shortwave. Although the television resolution problem had been solved by the end of the 1930s, World War II delayed its development until the middle 1940s.

Peering into the Future

But de Forest redeemed himself from that mistaken prediction with some other, very prescient ideas about television. In a series of articles in the *Hollywood Reporter* between 1943 and 1945, de Forest sounded a warning to the film industry about television: "For this new unknown stands in the minds capable of vague and mystical powers to rule or wreck what they have been earnestly building for the past three decades." De Forest continued to frame the coming media war as a survival of the fittest: "It cannot be questioned, therefore, that television is certain to eat hungrily into the very vitals of the cine-theatre. Television is on the march, or will be after VE Day. It




An early TV disc.

is inevitable." He warned about the ruinous effect of advertising on television: "Television advertisers must not attempt to blackjack the watching public with offensive television commercials. The surest way to smother television in its cradle is to expect to pour on the screen the same sort of vulgar bombast as now darkens millions of our radio dials except when news is on the air."

De Forest correctly saw the new media evolving out of the old, stating, "Television will not create a radically new art, but a thousand new stars, new writers, new directors—a new industry, yet based chiefly on what the motion picture and the radio have taught uswith much of Hollywood's lost motion and budget extravaganza deleted." He also saw opportunity: "Let it be understood by the film fraternity that, in this younger branch of their art, lie immeasurable opportunities for developing new techniques, new modes of audience approach, opportunities vastly more varied than any the theatre can afford them, then the progressive, far-sighted leaders among them will eagerly grasp the new vehicle, ride along with it, have a friendly controlling hand in directing its course."

In 1945 de Forest applied for a patent for a mechanical color television system, which he considered superior to the CBS color wheel. "I place before any kinescope face, even of a 16 inch diameter, a three-color mosaic screen," he explained. "It oscillates in an orbital, circular movement." Neither de Forest's nor the CBS system was accepted, the winner instead being the compatible RCA all-electronic system. He did receive a patent for a videotape recorder, likely similar enough to the Ampex Quad sys-

tem of 1956 to lose a patent challenge.

I'll leave you with this interesting head scratcher from a 1957 article in the *Los Angeles Examiner* headlined: "De Forest Files for Patent on 4-Inch Thick Wall TV Set." You may be saying to yourself, "well, I have one of those," but in 1957 even the smallest television set was several feet thick. According to the inventor: "The new flat set...is made possible by the use of printed circuitry to condense the bulky TV tube into a flat picture-like package." Prescient, indeed.

A Visit to the Early Television Museum, Hillard, Ohio

The Early Television Museum is a "must stop" for those interested in television history.

Recently I had the opportunity to visit the Early Television Museum, located in the town of Hillard, Ohio, near Columbus. I'm so glad I did—the museum is a "must stop" for historians and collectors of vintage televisions as well as anyone else interested in early communications.

While I was there, I also had the privilege of speaking with Steve McVoy, president of the museum, who gave me the museum's history first hand. The facility opened its doors in 2000 in what was a former warehouse in Hilliard. Steve's immersion in television goes back to his youth. As a teenager he had worked in a TV repair shop, and then later became a principle in a cable television business. After he sold the company in 1999 he was looking for a new challenge. He found his challenge in collecting vintage televisions. At first, all the televisions were located in his home and relegated to the basement. When his collection became too large he created the Early Television Museum. Lucky for us!

Initially occupying approximately 3,000 square feet of display space, the museum later expanded to 10,000 square feet, and today

there are over 150 televisions on display from the 1920s through the 1970s. The exhibits are well organized into different areas, and you'll find interesting examples of mechanical televisions, British televisions, pre-war electronic, post-war electronic, and more.

The museum's collection consists of many early televisions made by companies such as Baird, Western Empire State, Daven, Dumont,

National, RCA, Muntz, and Admiral. British manufacturers represented include HMV, RGD, and Cossor.

Each item on display has a full description of the piece with dates and important technical information. Most of the televisions are black & white sets, but you'll also find a nice collection of early color TVs, such as the RCA CT100.

I asked Steve which is his favorite television. He told me that many hold a special place in his collector's heart, but admitted that as far as style goes, his favorite is the 1938 British RGD 382-RG. The WGSF mobile truck also takes a pride of place.





Almost every month we publish auction results in the magazine. Did you know that we have a database of the auction prices online on our web

site? Subscribers can look at the auction results and they are SEARCHABLE! If you want to see if a specific radio, piece of equipment, tube, magazine, etc. that has been sold, all you have to do is enter the item and see every time the item has been sold as well as the price, auction house, and date!

ABILITY TO LOOK AT ONLY THE CLASSIFIED ADS

Subscribers can also look only at the classified ads without downloading the entire magazine. This is very useful for readers who just want to read the classified ads. Readers with dial up Internet service will save a lot of downloading time.

FREE MONTHLY CLASSIFIED AD

Each month a paid subscriber is entitled to place a free classified ad in the magazine. The classified ad can be up to 50 words. Additional words are 10 cents each. Classified ads can be submitted by email, fax, or mail. Typewritten preferred to reduce possible errors. Name, address and telephone number count as 6 words. Full name and address are required in all classified ads.

Your print subscriber user ID and password are on your mailing label. Online subscribers are emailed their user ID and password. Your user ID is the number after "SUB#" on your mailing label. Your password is the digits in brackets [xxxx] after your "SUB#".



On the Subscriber-Only Access page you can click on the Full Issue you would like to view or click on the Classified Ads section from that issue.



Go to A.R.C.'s home page <u>www.antiqueradio.com</u> and click on Subscriber Only Page.



Or you can click on the Auction Prices Data Base. Just enter the item that you are researching.
