

AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auction Burbank, Ohio, April 21, 2012

Auctions, this was the first one A.R.C. was able to attend. From our location on the East Coast, we headed west for a "radio road trip" to cover the auction, the Early Television Museum (see the June 2012 issue), and the Tri State Antique Radio Fest in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. It was a fabulous time, filled with unique collectables, fun bargain hunting, and friendly people, and we strongly recommend a radio-related trip like this to any of our readers who are able to make one.

It was especially nice to attend such an interesting and well-organized event as the Estes Auction. There was plenty of time to inspect the items and Richard Estes keep the auction moving at a quick rate.

Following is a list of the auction results for the major items, which included radios, televisions, ham gear, tubes, advertising, test equipment, phonographs, audio equipment, and speakers. Among the day's highlights were an Atwater Kent model 91 auto radio, which brought a bid of \$300; a RCA Radiotron tin sign, which sold for \$450; a Hallicrafters pushbutton TV, which went for \$225; a Regina music box, which sold for \$500; a Thorens 126 turntable that garnered \$475; an Atwater Kent model 10 breadboard that an attendee took home for \$675; and a Scott All Wave console that had reached \$1,300 at the sound of the gavel.

If you're ever in eastern Ohio at the right time, be sure to visit one of the Estes Auctions. You'll have a great time and might pick up some great additions to your collection.

RADIO HISTORY

The Timmerman-Greene– The Orphan of Vermont

For many of us, the word Vermont conjures visions of dairy farms, quaint bed & breakfasts, and Ben & Jerry's ice cream. Not many collectors realize, however, that there was also a radio produced there in the early 1920s that its manufacturer had hoped to make a real competitor in the rapidly growing radio market at the time. It was the Timmerman-Greene radio receiver.

Our story begins with the Morrisville foundry, a business in Morrisville, Vermont, operated by one Morris Greene. Looking for a new adventure, in 1921 Morris joined forces with Frederick Timmerman and his wife, Celema, to form the Timmerman-Greene Corporation. While Timmerman came up with the idea of manufacturing new products, Morris offered the machine skills he had developed in the foundry business.

The new company was located in a barn behind the Timmerman home, now gone. Its first invention was an automotive tool called the "Compress-It," which was to be used in the removal of valve springs in motor vehicles. But just as they were about to go into production, a major change in the automobile industry made the tool unnecessary, and the Compress-It proved a dead end. Undaunted, Timmerman searched around for another innovation to produce. This is where his idea for a radio receiver came in, and he soon designed a marvel of the airways called the "Timmerman Special."

The first of several different models was produced in 1923. It's interesting to note that no one in Morrisville owned a radio of *any* kind until 1922, when local resident A.L. Huntley finally went out and purchased one of these "new-fangled" wireless devices. When the radio industry turned to house current circuitry (AC), the little Timmerman-Greene company did not have the finances to compete with the larger manufacturers, and so in 1927, it quietly closed its doors for good.

Two Timmermans Today

There is a surviving Timmerman-Greene radio, probably one of the first prototypes, which is now owned by Robert Kitchel of Danville, Vermont. This first Timmerman set is a battery-type receiver using four (1-1/2 volt) Type 199 tubes and operated on six dry-cell batteries and one 45 volt dry-cell. Just looking at the condition of the set makes me to clean it up and restore it to its original condition, but that decision is up to the owner. He may wish to leave it in its present condition, and sometimes that can be a good thing.

The 15-1/4 x 8-1/2-inch-thick panel is of hard, red-rubber material, which has turned

pinkish-white and is slightly warped. There is no identification on the front. The construction inside is indeed crude. It's obvious that all the receiver parts are purchased from other manufacturers. They consist of two (2) New York "distortion-less" audio transformers; four (4) Pacent Bakelite No. 8 type 199 tube sockets; one (1) grid-leak holder; one (1) GE Type 1299 on/off rocker switch; all Fahnestock anti-ground clips; one (1) DeJur fine-wound rheostat; two (2) unbranded phone jacks; one (1) variable tuning condenser with a vernier trimmer (bank-wound); and one (1) unnamed smaller variable condenser connected to a green, Freshman-type open coil with seven (7) taps. The wiring is primitive, at best.

Alan Douglas of Pocasset, Massachusetts, who wrote the three-volume set *Radio Manufacturers of the 1920's*, thinks the circuit consists of one RF stage, a detector, and two audio stages. There is a slight possibility that this circuit may have appeared in a radio newspaper article back then, but we don't know for sure.

I know of one more Timmerman-Green set in existence. It is a newer entry, probably of TRF design of 1925, and its five tubes are probably the 01-A type. It has three large dials engraved 100–0 and a panel-mounted meter. Under the meter is a nine-point tap switch, which seems outmoded for 1925. Along the bottom are three jacks for each stage of amplification. Inside everything is copper shielded,

A Son's Shared Memory...

The following is from a 1979 letter to Frederick and Jane Greene of Morrisville:

One of my first memories (about 1923), was the scene during that year's World Series. My father (Frederick Timmerman), had built an amplifier and if the reception was unusually good, he hooked it up to a receiver with a separate speaker directed out the back window of his shop on Pleasant Street where relatively large numbers of mostly males gathered to listen to the game.

When reception was poor, either dad or Herb Strong would listen with headphones and repeat the commentary over what we now call a PA system, that is, using a microphone and the amplifier. I distinctly recall fifty or more folks sitting around the back yard listening to the play-by-play of the game.

including the three tuning condensers along with their attached coils. Also there is what looks like a wooden thread spool wrapped with aluminum behind the meter. Similar to the 1923 set, there is an on/off rocker switch on the left side of the panel. This later set used a more common Bakelite panel material. Like the earlier Timmerman, there are no markings on the panel at all, probably because the company did not own an engraving machine.

This 1925 receiver was previously owned by Herbert A. Smalley of Morrisville. Its original purchase price of \$225 seems high for the times, especially for Vermont. It currently resides in the Noyes House Museum (http:// noyeshousemuseum.org) in Morrisville. You can visit the museum on certain days from June through October. Check out their website or call 802-888-7617 for specifics. I would like to give thanks to the Noyes House Museum and the Morrisville Historical Society staff for the many photos I asked them to take for me. I had to wait for these all winter as the museum is closed from the late fall to late spring due to the cold temperatures.

RESTORATION REPORT

Restoring a Knight Model E-10803/E-10818 Table Radio

was in the post office one day mailing a package to Antique Radio Classified when the clerk asked me if I collected antique radios. He had seen quite a few of my packages addressed to A.R.C. and the Antique Radio Club of Illinois and wanted to know if I was involved with radios as a hobby. I told him I had a small collection but that I enjoyed restoration most of all. He explained that he had always wanted a nice old tube set after hearing stories his father told him about listening to the news about World War II on the radio and wondered if I could help him find one. I replied that I had several radios waiting to be restored and that he might like one of those. He wanted something in a wood case, which gave me a starting point, and I told him I'd see what I could come up with.

Several days later I discovered an old set I had almost forgotten about. It was given to me

some years ago and needed a lot of work. It was a small Broadcast-Shortwave wood table radio made by Knight, but the model was unknown. The chassis was filthy and rusted. The cabinet was dirty, the dial cover hazed and yellowed, and the finish was all but shot. The grille cloth was rotted and had holes poked in it all the way through the speaker cone in several places. Besides all the damage and dirt, however, it was mostly intact and no major parts were missing.


I took some photos of the candidate and showed the postal clerk what the set looked like. He was enthusiastic about it, even rough as it was. He was willing to take it as-is, but I refused and assured him that when he got the radio it would be in working condition. He was only hoping to get a display piece and was thrilled to think the old tubes would actually play again. His only stipulation was that

he did not want a full cosmetic restoration; he wanted the set to have character and look like it had been around for a long time. That part was easy.

First Steps with the Knight

The nameplate said "Knight," which was a brand name of Allied Radio in Chicago. I had no idea what the model was or whether I could get any service information. I could manage without a schematic, but things would go a lot faster and more easily with one. The tube lineup of 6A8G, 6Q7G, 6K7, 25L6G, and 25Z6G, all with registration dates in the mid 1930's¹, suggested late 1930s manufacture, so I started looking through the Allied Radio sections of the Rider's Perpetual Troubleshooters manuals, starting with 1935. I ruled out most based on the tube lineup and some based on chassis layout. Eventually I got to Volume 14 of the manuals, where a schematic and chassis layout for models E-10803 and E-10818 matched the set perfectly². This dated the set to about 1942. Compared to the tube lineups for the other sets in this volume

the tubes were rather obsolete, so I suppose that Allied was using up its old stock and getting rid of it.

There were several major problems that I had to address. Cleaning was the first. I pulled out the chassis and removed the speaker and dial assembly, both of which we will get back to later. Placing the chassis in the laundry sink I sprayed it with a mild cleaning solution and brushed the chassis and all the crannies with a soft bristle toothbrush. There were several rust spots that yielded to a wet scrubbing with a general-purpose purple Scotchbrite pad.

There's usually no danger to the chassis with a good cleaning and rinse as long as you don't drown it by dunking or direct spraying into the intermediate frequency transformers. This set had the old large footprint capacitortuned IF transformers with plenty of room inside and drainage space, and most of the parts, such as the tuning cap, switches, and volume control, could stand a splashing. After washing it, I set the chassis in front of an old squirrel cage furnace blower I use for restorations and let air blow on it for at least half an

hour (you can also use a canned air duster to blow the water out of the tube sockets, tuning capacitor, and other areas where water can get trapped). I then removed the cans from the IF transformers and verified that they had drained. I blew an air duster into the IF tuning capacitors to get out any trapped water. I also took the opportunity to replace the frayed grid cap wire from the first IF can to the 6K7 tube. The IF cans also needed some wet scrubbing with the Scotchbrite to remove corrosion and some dried up tape.


Restoration Details

After the cleaning I got into the details. I decided to start with the dial assembly. On many radios the dial assembly is part of the chassis. The main pulley is mounted on the shaft of the tuning capacitor and the dial cord routes around several small idler pulleys and loops around the tuning drive shaft. On this set the dial and cord drive was a separate assembly that could be removed completely from the radio. This made things a lot easier. I cleaned the assembly and lubricated the friction points. The old cotton dial cord was rotted and broken and lying loose, so I had to figure out how to re-string it. Fortunately the dial pointer was still hanging onto the cord. After several trial attempts I came up with a routing for the cord that worked without binding, moved the pointer the right direction to match the tuning frequency, and allowed more than the 180 degrees of rotation that was necessary for the tuning capacitor.

The dial cover had not shrunken too badly, but it was so yellowed and hazy you could not read the dial through it. The cover was a small rectangular window with an open slot in the top of it for the pointer to fit through from a

track located above. This unusual cover would have been tricky to order out from a professional. I made a new dial cover using the method that I had learned from Bill Turner, a well-known collector and restorer, and from my own experience making a dial cover for a Templetone military morale radio, described in an *A.R.C*. December 2009 article³. I had to make a special mold with a stepped section for the slot for the pointer. Once I re-strung the cord and made the cover, I cleaned and spraypainted the rusty pointer. I set aside the completed dial assembly for later.

Re-capping the set went smoothly. I found only two moderately out of tolerance resistors, which I replaced. I cleaned the band switch with a cotton swab soaked in Silvo followed by a thorough alcohol rinse. Usually a thorough cleaning of the rotating contacts will suffice; the stationary ones tend to get burnished by the rotary ones.

The power switch was bad and showed open conductance in either the ON or OFF position. I took the power switch apart to clean and adjust the contacts. That was a trial, but I managed to get it to work after an hour of fiddling.

Moving on to the volume control I found that the conductive element inside was broken and not repairable. And I'd doing so well up to then! The control was a typical 1M ohm audio taper, and I just happened to have a modern one in my parts drawer. The replacement had a perfect 1/4-inch diameter round shaft like the original, but it was about 3/4 of an inch too short. Not one to shrink from adversity in these matters, I decided to extend the shaft. I drilled and tapped a 4-40 threaded hole down the center axis of the control shaft and screwed in about half the length of a short 4-40 threaded rod. I got a 1/4-inch diameter by 3/4-inch long 4-40 threaded steel standoff and screwed it onto the rod, locking the threads with a tiny dab of polyurethane glue. The result was magnificent—OK, it was adequate and didn't look too goofy.

The Biggest Challenge

From the looks of it, the hardest job was going to be the speaker. It had several serious tears and holes in it. For several years I had casually looked for a replacement field coil speaker for this set, but I never found anything. The field coil was 2500 ohm and rather higher resistance than most. Looking at the schematic I discovered that the field coil was not part of the power supply filter, as is usually the case. It was simply an electromagnet field coil powered by the power supply. I could have replaced it with a permanent magnet speaker and left it at that, but I decided instead to take up the challenge and see if I could repair the cone.

I started by cleaning off the accumulated dirt and gathering all the pieces of the cone together. Most of the pieces were still attached. I made some patches out of the lightweight, nonwoven waterproof material from Folger's one cup coffee bags. I sized them to cover the areas of the cone that were damaged. I watered down a little Elmer's glue and applied a coating to one side of the patches. I applied the patches to the back of the cone and maneuvered the loose flaps of cone paper into their original positions, filling in the tears and holes using the patch as a frame to hold them in place. After the glue dried I used a small paintbrush to apply more Elmer's glue to the remaining small tears and the seams between the torn shards of cone. This approach turned out surprisingly well and the speaker worked when I ran tests on it later. It probably is not working to original specs, but it sounded reasonable.

The other problems with the speaker were the audio and field coil leads. The cotton/rubber insulation was hard and breaking off. I cut the wires short and spliced on new cloth wire of the appropriate color and length. I then covered the splices with black heat shrink tubing.

Finishing Touches

It was now time to re-assemble and clean up small details. I put the dial back on and got it aligned. I reinstalled the speaker and wired it. This Knight set has a ballast resistor for the heater string that looks much like a typical metal tube and is installed in a standard octal socket. It was still functional but very rusty, so I bead-blasted the rust and remaining paint down to bare metal and repainted it with a semi-gloss black metal paint. Checking the tubes I found that none of them were bad. A couple of them were weak but still functional.

About the last thing was to install a new line cord. Like many of these old transformerless radios, the AC power line is connected directly to the chassis. In the days before polarized plugs it was just random chance which way the plug was inserted into the outlet, and it was possible to have the 120 volt AC line voltage on the chassis and knob shafts. This situation is called having a "hot" chassis. Back then folks didn't concern themselves with things like shock and electrocution hazards with exposed 120 volt power on a chassis with no back on the cabinet!

Some radios connect one conductor of the AC cord directly to the chassis while the other conductor goes through the power switch to the circuitry. This is the safest method, provided the chassis side of the line cord is plugged into the neutral side of the outlet. If not, you get 120 volts on the chassis full time. Other sets switched one conductor through the power switch to the chassis while the other conductor went directly to the circuitry. This is the worst of configurations because while the chassis may be grounded through the switch when the radio is on, it becomes ungrounded and floats to 120 volts when the power is off. And, of course, if the 120 volts is connected to

the switch the chassis is hot when the power is on. Either way, the chassis is always going to be hot under one condition or the other. The advantage to this wiring is that it tends to minimize AC hum coupling from the switch to the volume control.

The Knight was wired with the power switch in the chassis leg of the line cord. I changed that and wired the hot side of a polarized line cord through the power switch to the circuitry and connected the neutral side of the cord directly to the chassis. I don't like even this arrangement because it is still possible to unknowingly plug the radio into a miswired outlet.

I replaced the tubes in their sockets and did an alignment with instruments. The chassis was ready and working well. I did not have much to do on the cabinet. I did some cleaning and removed the major dirt infestation. I removed the old grille cloth and replaced it. The chassis slid right in and the new dial glass fit perfectly in the opening. The final task was to solder a wire onto the antenna terminal and deliver the radio.

A Knight to Treasure

This radio had sat in my basement for quite a few years, just waiting for me to have the time and motivation for a restoration. One never knows what turn of events will bring a similarly half-forgotten radio to the bench and maybe even find it a new home where it will find a new life as a treasured piece of history.

My thanks to Mike Urban of Urban Antique Radio and Vintage Hi-Fi for supplying me with a piece of appropriate grille cloth. Grille cloth has gone out of production and is very hard to find.




