MEET REPORT

New England Antique Radio Club Meet Brookline, New Hampshire, June 16, 2012

n June 16, 2012, the New England Antique Radio Club (NEARC) held its spring radio swap meet at the Brookline Event Center on RT 130 in Brookline, New Hampshire. This is a new venue for the NEARC semi-annual swap meet, and while some people reported having a little trouble finding the place, most attendees got there without issue (my Garmin GPS took me right to the front door).

The meet marked the first time the club offered flea market spaces outside for those who wanted to tailgate. The event center's own staff handled outdoor space assignments and other duties, all very professionally. Food and drink was available indoors.

The weather could not have been better. The sun shone brightly all morning, with hardly a cloud in the sky, and the temperature was perfectly mild. There were several vendors that took advantage of the outdoor spaces (myself included) and by 8 a.m. the spaces were pretty much full. The event center also offers an outside tent in case of rain.

As many of you know, some of the previous locations for the NEARC swap meet

were poorly lit; I'm happy to report that this was not the case at the Brookline Event Center. When I walked inside the building the first thing I noticed was that the room was bright and clean, making it easy to see everything clearly. Most tables were also full by 8 a.m., and there was plenty of activity from buyers, sellers, and browsers. I noticed that radios from the 1920s through 1960s were well represented and ran the gamut from high-end radios to restoration projects. There was truly something for everyone.

Around 11:30 a.m. the crowd started to thin out and the dealers packed up and headed home. I talked to several dealers and most said

sales were on the weak side. Personally, I sold two radios from the 1920s, several vacuum tubes, an RCA projector, a variac, and several Radio News magazines. Overall it was a very good day for me.

I believe that this may very well be the best location for the NEARC to date, offering indoor and outdoor spaces and run by an extremely professional staff. The next swap meet will be held at the Brookline Event Center in September. I hope to see you all there.

A Visit to Leeds Radio— An Echo of New York City's Radio Row

adio Row in downtown New York City is long gone. Unfortunately, I was too young to have visited that area, which is a legend for so many of us dedicated "radio types." I am happy to say that in my younger years, I did visit the stores on 45th Street in Manhattan, but those are now only memories. The Canal Street shops have also disappeared, too. But enough wistful nostalgia; on to present day.

Recently I traveled to the borough of Brooklyn, New York (official name Kings County), to visit what I believe is the only survivor of Radio Row: Leeds Radio.

Feels Like Old Times

Leeds Radio was founded in 1923 and occupied a some real estate on Vesey Street in lower Manhattan (official name New York County). In the early 1960s the Radio Row area in Manhattan was torn down and replaced by the World Trade Center complex of buildings, and the old establishments had to find new homes. Leeds moved to the Williamsburg section of Brooklyn in the early 1980s.

Leeds is owned today by Richard Matthews. Matthews purchased the company in 1994 from Bernie Goldstein. According to

Matthews, Goldstein was a bit of an eccentric and curmudgeon who had no problem arguing with customers and occasionally telling them to "get lost" (our translation).

Matthews is an electronics engineer whose specialty is in EMI/RFI design and applica-

tions. As a long-time customer of Goldstein's, Matthews would travel from his home in Manhattan to wander the rows of parts and equipment at Leeds. One Saturday in 1993 Richard was shopping late in the day when he heard Goldstein mutter, "If I could get out

of this place, I would." On a whim, Matthews said "I'll buy this place." A year later, he got what he wished for.

Today Leeds is a 2,400-square-foot facility that is an electronic wonderland. Electronics geeks like me just can't help wandering up and down the aisles for hours looking at everything. Matthews' customers include antique radio collectors, electronic hobbyists, hams, engineers, vintage audio listeners, musicians, and more. It was also great to hear that many young people come in to visit and learn about electronics.

Even though the accompanying photographs may give the impression that the shelves hold mysterious messes, believe me, everything is extremely well organized, and Matthews knows the location of every item. While you no longer can purchase the "Leeds listening monitor," Vibroplex products, receivers, or transmitters listed in the 1930 advertisement reprinted here, this is a great go-to place for all sorts of parts and other items. You can still purchase transformers, lamps, condensers (capacitors), resistors, and wire. Matthews can also point you to any number of CRTs (sorry, though, no 10BP4s), electronic hardware including standoffs, Fahnestock clips, and shaft couplers, inductors, knobs, meters (both new and used), relays, rheostats, pots, semiconductors, switches, tube sockets, and much, *much* more. While more parts than tubes are sold, Matthews does have both receiving and transmitting tubes—probably a total of 100,000! There's even vintage test equipment available in a small section of the warehouse.

This is not a surplus place filled with old military gear or junk; it's definitely a step up and offers better quality items.

If you're ever in the New York City area, you owe it to yourself to stop by Leeds Radio and check it out. It will feel like a visit back in time, to the kind of place that disappeared long ago, replaced by catalogs and the Internet. Visit the website for hours and directions. If New York is too far to travel, however, don't fret—Matthews says about 90 percent of his business is mail order.

Maybe I'll see you in the aisles.

A Rag-Tag Tag Sale

ow many of us have been to a garage sale? O.K. everyone, you can put your hands down.

It really comes as no surprise that most of the collectors *A.R.C.* speaks with have stopped by a garage sale or similar event at least once. Many attend more often...often, much more often!

Now I'm not talking about those wonderful warm weather events—hamfests, computer fairs, and flea markets—we radio fans flock to each spring and summer. I mean your friendly neighborhood soup-to-nuts-and-kitchen-sink sale-a-thons that seem to sprout on nearly every suburban front lawn. They go by different names in different areas of the country. They're dubbed garage sales, yard sales, rummage sales, tag sales, moving sales, even estate sales.

I live in the greater metropolitan New York City area, specifically on western Long Island. This area, as a sprawling suburb of New York City, is very densely populated. Our garden-variety yard sales are usually just someone putting some items in the driveway, without any advertising or promotion. Despite their name, garage sales are also usually held outside, too, but typically have some sort of promotion, such as Internet or local advertising, such as placing posters on phone poles. Tag sales are most often held indoors and have lots of promotion. Items may or may not have a price tag. In western Long Island there are a number of professional companies who will

organize tag sales and take a commission for people who don't want to run the event themselves. Usually, there'll be a website that lists the date and time of the sale and possibly have photographs of the house contents. The professional sale organizers know how to attract people.

In my travels, I've found that pretty much every area of the country has its own version of the "Great American Tag Sale."

The Big Sale

On a recent Sunday, I learned about a large tag sale just a few blocks from my house. Checking the sale's website, I saw photos of the items. It looked like the kind of thing our readers see nightly in their dreams. This was a hoarder's...um, collector's...home, and he had been hoarding/collecting most of his life. Metal shelves lined with equipment climbed the walls and spread across every inch of the floor. Both the first and second floors of this home seemed to be bursting with electronic equipment, including antique radios, parts, manuals, catalogs, communications equipment, and audio equipment.

The website said the sale would start Sunday morning at 9:30.

Here in the New York metro area we have our own way of "doing" tag sales. People arrive early to get on line so they'll be the first to go through the contents. The organizers allow about 10 to 15 people in the house at a time, even keeping a list so nobody "acciden-

tally" gets in front of someone else. Because we have such a high population density, and because the professional sale organizers did such a good promotion job, I expected a lot of people to attend.

Since the address was just minutes from my own house, I decided to drive by at 10:30 the night before to see exactly where the sale would be. Already there were people on line!!! I couldn't believe it—this was 13 hours before the start of the sale! I spoke to one person—third in line—who intended to catch some sleep in his car. On this occasion situation, the early arrivals (very wisely, I'd say) started their own list of when people arrived. The organizers of the tag sale were supposed to arrive at 7 a.m. and would start their own list at that point. It was insane.

When the tag sale began at 9:30 there were 60 people waiting to get into the house. Of course, the temperature was 95 degrees and the house had no air-conditioning, not even an open window. At one point there were about 25 people in the basement, where I estimated the temperature to be around 100—I couldn't begin to estimate the humidity! Nothing had price tags; instead you had to make a pile of items on the main floor and then negotiate with the organizers. Also, you had to be darn careful that nothing disappeared from your pile!

I heard an awful lot of complaining that hot day in the hoarder's home. But for some reason people (including me) kept on rifling and rummaging for as long as they could. And for some crazy reason, I guess we all thought it was well worth the effort.

AT HOME WITH THE COLLECTOR

In Lou's Lair — Nuggets of Treasure from a Northeast Goldmine

ye been a principal engineer (RF and microwave) for about 31 years and an antique electronics collector for 40-plus years. I've also been a member of the AWA (Antique Wireless Association), the IEEE (Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers), and an active amateur radio operator (callsign KA1HIH) for a long time. But my interest in antique radios goes back even further. I have been repairing/restoring antique radios and equipment since I was 12 years old. As a young child I would look inside the radio my parents kept in our kitchen.

That set had a molded handle on the top with an opening where you could see the tubes light up while the set was operating. I was fascinated. What was that red glow and how did this all work? It was an Emerson Model #511, and I spent a lot of time searching—successfully!—on eBay for another one so I could relive that time.

As a teenager, my friends and I used to go around the neighborhood looking for "old stuff" to play around with. One of my first acquisitions was a 1958 Zenith B&W television set that a neighbor had in his backyard.

He told us the set didn't work, and we asked if we could have it. We brought it home and after a few adjustments the set was back in operation! (I think the technician who told him it didn't work may have done a little bit of deliberate "mis-tweaking" of the horizontal width control so he could sell him a new set!) That was over 40 years ago, and the set still works today!

I am as much an engineer as I am a technical historian. Once I find an item I'm interested in, I spend a lot of time just researching the company that manufactured it, when it was made, how many were made, what the economic conditions were like when it was made, etc. The history of an item can be as interesting as the item itself.

About My Collection

My collection pretty much covers the following categories:

- TVs from the late 1940s and 1950s—A number of seven-inch electrostatic sets and 10- and 12-inch table models.
- Radios, pre-World War II—Some tall 1930s sets with metal tubes and many prestock market crash TRF sets (I have a particular fondness for these). I also have quite a collection of cathedral radios.

- Radios, post-World War II—Lots of colorful plastic radios (All American Fives)
- Miscellaneous antique test equipment— I believe no one should work on old radios without old tube testers, oscilloscopes, etc.

Some of my favorite "jewels" in my collection include the following:

- A mint condition RCA AR 812 receiver from 1924. It's missing the leather handle, but who would call it portable?! This is the receiver Edwin Howard Armstrong designed—Google it!
- A National Model #TV. This seven-inch TV in wood is fully restored and working
- An Emerson Model # 511 set. I have one white, one black, and one in wood.
- A 1958 RCA B&W 19-inch TV in a metal case. It's in working condition with original parts (it's that TV I collected "way back when")
- A 1949 Admiral Model #22X12 TV in bakelite. I restored this bakelite console TV working order, complete with connected converter box and period rabbit ears.
- An Atwater Kent TRF set with period speaker. I use this one a lot in my basement lab.

The accompanying, somewhat fuzzy (sorry, high-quality cameras are not in my collection!) photographs show some of my prize possessions. These all reside in my home—I would never store these in a barn or shed (I tried the experiment for several months once with bad results).

For future collectibles, I would love to obtain any radios that are pre-1929 (TRF sets). TVs that are pre-World War II are also desired. I find the history of early television just as fascinating as early radio.

I hope that you enjoy playing your antique radios as much as I enjoy fixing and collecting them. There is something special about getting something to work that has not functioned for over 50 years. Just imagine what these radios "heard" when they were new: the Hindenburg disaster, the start of World War II, President Roosevelt's Fireside Chats, the Apollo Moon Landing...

What a wonderful hobby this is!
